Unit 1

This first unit introduces creative learning and creativity with children and young people and asks you to explore...

- *Why creative learning is important.
- *What the difference is between creative learning and creativity.
- *The developmental benefits to children and young people.

Unit 2

This second unit will help you...

- *Identify the differences between natural and creative learning
- *Understand how children and young people engage with the creative process.
- *You will also be required to take part in an arts practical.



Unit 3

This third unit will consider...

- *Barriers to learning.
- *Supporting young people in their activities.
- *Planning and preparing your own activities.
- *Preparing and delivering your own arts workshop.

Practical activities do form part of this course so participants must be DBS/CRB checked.

The Arts Award (for ages 12+)

These awards are based upon a personal learning programme which develops and assesses both arts-related and transferable skills, such as creativity, communication, planning and teamwork.

Bronze Arts Award

Course ref: AA115

Bronze is currently the most popular award, with nearly 20,000 young people achieving it every year. It's often run with whole classes in schools, and widely offered in arts organisations and youth projects.

To achieve Bronze, a Level 1 award on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF), learners will:

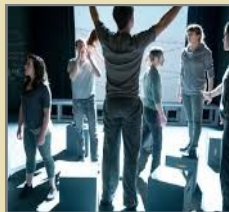
- *Take part in an arts activity they enjoy,
- *Go to an arts event,
- *Research their arts inspiration
- *Share their skills with others



Silver Arts Award

Course ref: AA215

Doing Silver involves achieving an arts challenge, reviewing arts events, researching artists and arts organisations, and delivering an arts leadership project with other people. It is designed to be taken by young people aged 14+



The Silver Arts Award, a Level 2 qualification on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF).

There are two units:

- *Unit 1: Arts practice
- *Unit 2: Arts leadership.

Gold Arts Award

Course ref: AA315

The Gold Arts Award is the highest level at Level 3 on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF), and develops young people's creativity, communication, planning, teamwork and leadership skills.

Gold has two units:

- *Unit 1: Personal arts development
- *Unit 2: Arts projects leadership.



Discover and Explore the Arts

Arts Award Discover is an introductory award, designed for ages 5 and above, but is open to children and young people aged up to 25.

To achieve an Arts Award Discover, children and young people collect evidence in an individual arts log of their experiences of:

- taking part in arts activities
- researching artists or craftspeople and their work
- sharing their arts discoveries and arts leadership.

To achieve an **Arts Award Explore**, children and young people collect evidence in an individual arts log of their experiences of:

- taking part in a range of arts activities, including a personal response about what has inspired them about taking part
- the work of artists or craftspeople and arts organisations
- creating a piece of art work
- sharing with others what they have enjoyed and/or achieved through completing their Arts Award
